ORTONA	1		New Year Day was remarkably quiet all along the front, no arty or mortar fire, just an enterprising sniper disturbing the stillness. Weather clear and cool.	R.A.
	2		Bn still in same pos with the exception of a pl of A Coy which is acting as a standing patrol on the tunnel mouth 311180, right flank of Carl & York R. Intermittent enemy shelling during the day and just after last light he laid down harassing fire on our front but this was quickly discouraged by our mors.	R.A.
	3		A Coy from each unit will be sent for a period of eight days intensive trg under Div arrangements to an area near Liviano. This is part of a plan to absorb the large nos of reinforcements now coming into the Div and bring the whole up to an efficient fighting standard. Word received today that Capt J P Fletcher and Lieut J C MacNeill have been award of the MC and Cpl J A MacLeod the MM for the actions prior to Campobasso.	R.A.
	4 0900		The CCRA and Brig Gibson visited the arty OPs this area. Three officers of HMG arrived on exchange with this unit.	App 2
	1530		The 3rd also eight 2nd mors of this unit took part in the all day arty and mortar fire plan on Pt 39 and targets in the vicinity. C Coy, West N S R plied under comd of Carl & York R and moved fwd in a pos of readiness to assist them in their attack on Pt 39. The attack was successful and at last light West N S R received orders to change posns with Carl & York R. Move was completed at 2400 hrs, Bn now held roughly square 3018 and slightly North and East. 	5 0400		Enemy lly down harassing arty and mort fire our area commencing at this time and continued intermittently throughout the day, special attention being paid to the two Coy areas. Vigorous patrolling up into enemy territory is now the order of the day.	R.A.

ORTOMA	6	0950	<p>Lt Gen H D G Crerar CB also comdr 1 Cdn Corps accompanied by Brig Gibson visited the Br area this morning. Very active patrolling now being carried out by this unit, chiefly at night but sometimes during daylight as well. As part of this program, a patrol of 14 ORs under Lieut A M Mills of D Coy had a rather interesting brush with the enemy this morning. At approximately 0900 hrs this patrol was proceeding West across country towards P.W. June 293177 when they came under enemy mort fire from feature to NW. Moving North in an endeavour to get cover they came upon an enemy pl posn with the occupants very much off their guard. Our patrol killed ten of the enemy at this point and secured twelve PW but when they started to return with the PW they again came under very heavy mort fire from "High ground" to the NW. This was so intensive that the patrol was forced to scatter and endeavour to get back on their own. The PW were, of course, lost in the resulting confusion, not, however before three were killed, at least one by their own fire. Own casualties, 1 OR killed 1 OR wounded.</p>	App 4 & 5 <i>Rpt</i>
	7		<p>Lt Col R S E Waterman this morning proceeded to Br H Q to meet Gen Leese who has succeeded Gen Montgomery as comdr of 8th Army. From information received from patrols and from observation it is suspected that the enemy occupy the buildings immediately NW of bridge (305188) during the hrs of darkness only. To verify this a patrol of one officer, Lieut D A Campbell and ten ORs from A Coy was sent out at 1100 hrs, under cover of arty and mort preparation on ridge immediately North and West of bridge. Patrol came under heavy mort and mort fire from the spur immediately West of bridge and were pinned down here until last light (1730 hrs). Casualties 4 ORs killed and 5 ORs wounded. 	9		Increased enemy arty activity this area to "ay. West N S R carried out vigorous patrolling night 9/10. One of these was originally intended to go by water for which purpose two small boats had been brought fwd by lorry and launched in the Carl & York area but this plan had to be abandoned due to the fact that the moon was high all night with no cloud cover. That patrol (Lieut Shurkey and 20 ORs #1) however penetrate the enemy pos' to an approximate depth of one half mile by travelling on or near the beach and secured much valuable information.	1st
	10		Our pos's were shelled fairly by throughout the "ay. Vigorous patrolling carried by own tps during the hrs of daylight and darkness. At 1800 hrs D & A Cos change pos's. This is part of a schedule that gives the right fwd Coy relief every 48 hrs. Right fwd Coy pos' is the hot spot of the Bn area. A Coy now right fwd, D left fwd.	1st
